PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

At last we have been able to get into some form of normality this week with all our students back in class again and our learning program back in action. As required we are continuing to operate in two "cohorts" K- 2 and 3-6, with separated playground areas etc. I have particularly enjoyed having students coming to visit me to show me their quality work that they have been doing. I have some pictures below of some of my visitors.



Rapid antigen home testing of close contacts

I hope and pray that we will not have to run through the Public Health Order scenarios again like we did earlier this month. If we do have a situation of a positive case who has been infectious in the school community, we will apparently have Rapid antigen home testing (RAHT) protocols to allow "close contacts" to return school faster.

It would seem that Rapid Antigen Home Testing will be made available for primary aged students to mitigate the amount of time close contacts of a positive case may be unable to attend school for face-to-face learning.

The use of RAHT will support primary students who are identified as close contacts to return to school earlier than the 14 day isolation period requirement. Primary students who use RAHT as an additional screening tool will be able to return to face-to-face learning from Day 8 of their isolation period.

Parents who opt in to use RAHT will be able to send their students back to school for face-toface learning if they consistently produce a negative standard PCR (nose and throat swab) test and daily rapid antigen test results. This does not reduce the overall Health requirements for isolation. An <u>exemptionExternal link</u> is in place to allow school students who are identified close contacts to attend school after receiving a negative standard PCR (nose and throat swab) test taken on or after day 6 of the self-isolation period, subject to the conditions outlined in the exemption.

If the school is identified by NSW Health then information packages and procedures will come with the test kits. **PLEASE NOTE: The school will not be administering the RAHT. It will be administered by the familes of the close contact student** and results uploaded by a QR code system apparently. Like I said, I hope we do not need to have to discover the joys of this protocol.

Drop off and pick up

Morning drop off will remain as normal at the front gate. They will then move from the gate to: K-2 - the Hall COLA area, 3-6 The main COLA area. We have adjusted our pick times in the afternoons.

- Years K-2 are released at 2.45 pm (students with older siblings wait on seats near community room)
- Year 3-6 are released at 2.50 pm

Parents/carers who are picking up by car, please make sure your child knows they are being collected by car. We often lose time having to collect students from the other gate. It also helps greatly for us to speed things up if you have your **name card visible**. We also ask that if the car in front pulls out and you are not yet having your child/ren loading into the car that you "roll up" to closer to the front of the queue so that other cars can join the queue from the rear. We would much rather load students into the cars from the front of the queue **Please do not leave your vehicle if you are in the queue**.

Attendance

Students are **expected to attend school** unless they are unwell or have even with mild symptoms of COVID-19. Any person with any COVID-19 symptoms must be sent home and not return to school unless:

- they have isolated for 10 days, when no medical certificate is available
- they have a negative COVID-19 test result and are symptom free.

In circumstances where children have other medical reasons for recurrent symptoms, a letter from their GP is sufficient to negate the requirement for a negative test.

Anyone who is unwell with COVID-19 symptoms is strongly encouraged to get tested and selfisolate until a negative result is received.

Students not attending school (without Public Health order restrictions) will **<u>NOT</u>** be supported by "Learning from Home" structures and online feedback from MEPS staff.


