STOP PRESS...TUESDAY 7TH DECEMBER - INDUSTRIAL ACTION BY THE NSW TEACHERS FEDERATION.

Next Tuesday 7th December, there will be a 24 hour strike by members of the NSW Teachers Federation in support of their "More than Thanks" campaign addressing teacher shortages across the state, excessive teacher workload and lack of salary competitiveness. A significant majority of teaching staff at MEPS will be participating in this industrial action with only a small "skeleton staff" on the school site delivering "minimal supervision" on Tuesday 7th December. The school will not be able to run in its usual organisational structure or deliver its regular program of learning activities. In addition, it will be extremely difficult to maintain the separate cohorts that we have been maintaining in an attempt to meet our COVID safety plan as a level 3 school.

Official correspondence from the Dept of Education was sent home with students on Friday 3rd December and also posted on our seesaw app and Facebok page. Members of staff handed out letters to parents/ carers outlining the Teachers Federation viewpoint on the issue.








BIRTHDAY BUCKETS FROM THE CANTEEN!
