A few procedural things this edition...

Parent teacher interviews

Don't forget to book your Parent Interview slots that will be running in weeks 10 and 11!It is a great opportunity for you to talk with your child's teacher and gain insight into strengths and opportunities for your child's learning. If you haven't yet booked, there is an infographic below which you can click on to go the booking sheet.



I don't miss the irony of posting this section underneath the parent teacher interview message, but I know that at many other times in the year that strong communication is the best way to ensure all aspects of our school run smoothly. Whether it's communication through the school newsletter, via text message, notes home, the school Facebook page or a phone call, email, Seesaw or a face-to-face chat, we use all of these different methods to get messages home, and often more than one method for the same message.

One of the best benefits of the lovely size of our school is that all of our staff get to know all of our students fairly quickly, which is pretty special. If we're worried or have a question about your child, their progress or wellbeing, someone from school will give you a call or send you a message to have a chat.

As a parent and an educator for a long time, I know that sometimes you may also have a question or a concern about things at school. If you're worried about your child's progress or wellbeing or a specific incident at school, the classroom teacher is always the first port of call, as they have the most contact with your child and know them well. Our teachers are always keen to chat with you about your child/ren - after all, we see them for 6 hours a day, they're like our extended family:) - however please be mindful that our teachers are preparing for the day in the morning and some staff meetings are also held in the morning. During the day they're teaching, undertaking playground duty and often running extra-curricular activities in their lunch and recess breaks. You are welcome to send them a message, or leave a message throughout the day, and if they can, our teachers will get back to you on the same day however sometimes it may be after school or the next day if there are things they need to look into in order to answer your question. Our teachers may call you or send you a message via Seesaw, depending on what's appropriate.

In addition, each Stage has its own Assistant Principal who is there to support students, teachers and families who may need some more specialised or intensive support. Playground issues that may be more serious are also referred to them. Just remember that most things can be resolved with a chat either in person or over the phone - please do that wherever possible.

If it hasn't been resolved by either the teacher or the Assistant Principal, or if it's of a very serious nature, then I will also be involved. I am more than happy to have a chat about concerns, although depending on the issue it may also require input from the class teacher and possibly the Assistant Principal.

If your child is in Kindergarten, Mrs Kate Payne is the Assistant Principal you would contact. Mrs Natalie Johnson is the Assistant Principal for Years 1 and 2 Whilst Mrs Sophie Bailey (Tues / Wed and Mr Ryan Barbuto (Mon, Thurs, Fri) Job share the Assistant Principal role for Years 3 - 6.

When I started teaching back in 1985, my first principal used to say to our learning community: " If you have an issue let me know ...and give me a chance to fix it... before you complain to the neighbours". I ask the same for our MEPS school community. If I don't know about it, I can't fix it!

On a final note on this topic, unless it's an emergency, I don't contact my staff after 5.30pm, as that's their family and personal time. Please be respectful of our staff by being mindful of the time that you send a message and the timeframe in which you expect them to respond. Thank you for your support and understanding - our teachers here at MEPS are amazing; they constantly go above and beyond for all of our students and we appreciate the partnership we have with all parents, carers and families in helping our students grow and learn.

Kiss and Ride

Please be mindful when dropping off /picking up students in our Kiss and Ride car zone - especially in the afternoon. We have a poster above that outlines our school "rules"...If the parking inspectors visit and you leave the car or park too long...\$183 dollars is an expensive lesson!!! Usually it is when someone gets a grandparent or a neighbour to cover a pick up that things go awry..please make sure they know the "rules"! I cannot stress enough the importance of using what the Dept of transport call the safety door (Rear left). Kids walking around to get in the right side on a narrow street is not good for my heart rate!

Staff Development Day Term 3 - Variation to date

I will have more on this in our next newsletter; however, In order to meet our professional learning goals we need to look at gaining some expertise in certain fields. In order to do this it can be quite difficult when all schools across the state are trying to gain the same expertise on the same days.

Accordingly I wish to apply to the Dept of Education to vary our Term 3 Staff Development Day from Monday 17th July (the Monday after the school holidays) to Monday 18th September (Monday of the last week of term). This would mean that students and staff would attend school as a normal day on 17th July, but on Monday September 18th classes at MEPS would not run as staff would be attending professional development activities offsite. I have had some initial talks with WEMOOSH to see what could be possibly run on Sept 18 during school hours as a kind of vacation care activity option during the day, but final details or options are not yet available due to intricacies of rostering, availability of activities etc. to be investigated.

As I said I'm just flagging this as a type of "claim the date" advance notice and I'll have more details in our next newsletter.



The winning house will have an end of year celebration.




Whole School - Values
